

# FOPP Program

The (non-violent) offender Prostitution Program (FOPP), also known as “john school”, is a diversion program that seeks to end the demand for commercial sexual exploitation in San Antonio by reducing recidivism among those who solicit prostitution.

## The Goals:

- Educate offenders on dangers of solicitation and engaging in sexual conduct with a prostitute, sexually transmitted diseases, and other crimes such as theft, robbery, and forgery.
- Educate offenders about victimization of sex workers from assault, robbery, sexual assault, and murder.
- Decrease demand and reduce supply

# Requirements

- Non-violent Offenders
- No previous history, arrests, charges, or convictions of violent crimes in Texas or any other State.
- If attorney representing State consents to defendant’s participation.
- If Police Department refers to program in lieu of arrest.
- No previously conviction of offense under Section 20A.02, 43.02, 43.03, 43.04, or 43.05 Penal Code.
- No offense listed under Section 3g(a) (1), Article 42.12, Code of Criminal Procedure.

EOH is a faith-based, 501(c) 3 tax exempt, NGO, specializing in advocacy for both survivors of the commercial sex trade, prostitution intervention, and diversion programs to end the demand.

# John School

## *Offender (non-violent) Prostitution Intervention Program (FOPP)*

A diversion program for men, who are (non-violent) offenders, and solicit prostitution. (“John School”)



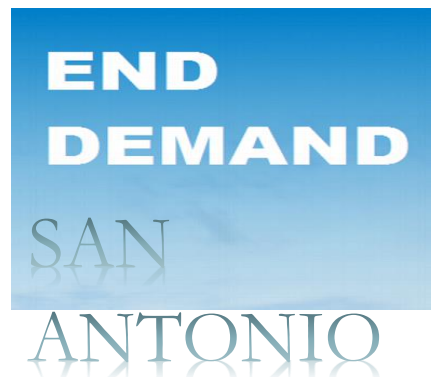


## Program Services

- Monthly/8 hour demand reduction class *\*fee based on income*
- Free testing for STD/Aids/HIV
- Access to services relating to Family Violence/Domestic Abuse
- Access to information, services relating to sex/porn addiction, sexually transmitted diseases.
- 16 Week Group Counseling (Licensed Professional Counselor) with focus on sex addiction, porn addiction, cybersex addiction. *(up to 12 in a group) \*fees apply*
- Individualized Counseling (LPC) *\*fees apply*
- Aftercare

## Program Benefits

- Non-adversarial approach between law enforcement, defense and prosecutors.
- Aids probation in providing new, alternative treatment solutions and support.
- Reduces Community Service.
- Effective treatment reduces recidivism not previously addressed.
- Lowers tax payer dollars spent on incarceration.
- Lowers risk of domestic violence and sexual assault due to education and specialized services.
- Stops the spread of STD's.
- Promotes community health.
- Early identification.
- Prompt placement for those who are eligible.



Participants who complete PIP often become strong community members who join the fight against sexual exploitation and human trafficking.
